

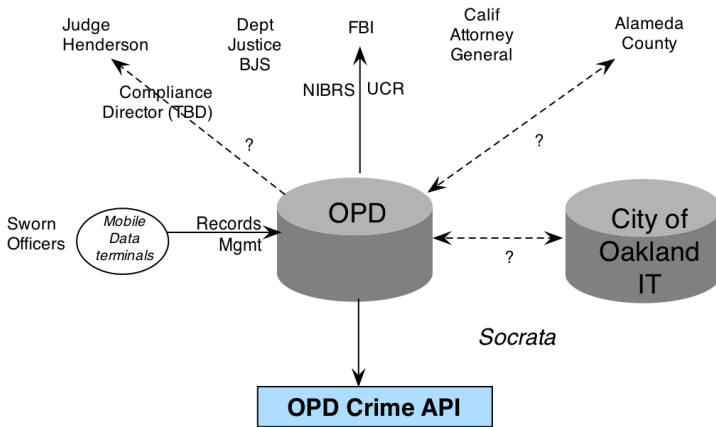

Proposed extensions to OPD's current data **highlighted**

- Denver: Incident_Id, Offense_Id, **Offense_Code (NCIC)**, Offense_Code_Extension, **Offense_Type_Id (NBIRS)**, Offense_Category_Id, **First_Occurrence_Date**, **Last_Occurrence_Date**, **Reported_Date**, Incident_Address, **Geo_X**, **Geo_Y**, Geo_Lon, Geo_Lat, District_Id, Precinct_Id, Neighborhood_Id, Shape
- Chicago: ID, Case Number, Date, Block, **IUCR**, Primary Type, Description, Location Description, Arrest, Domestic, Beat, District, Ward, Community Area, **FBI Code**, X Coordinate, Y Coordinate, Year, Updated On, Latitude, Longitude, Location
- Baltimore
 - Arrests: Arrest, **Age**, **Sex**, **Race**, Arrestdate, Arresttime, Arrestlocation, Incidentoffense, Incidentlocation, Charge, Chargedescription, District, Post, Neighborhood
 - Victim: Crimedate, Crimetime, **Crimecode**, Location, Description, **Weapon**, Post, District, Neighborhood

Publishing constraints

- Withheld data
 - *In accordance with legal restrictions against identifying sexual assault and child abuse victims and juvenile perpetrators, victims, and witnesses of certain crimes, this site includes the following precautionary measures: (a) Sexual assaults are not included. (b) Child abuse cases, and other crimes which by their nature involve juveniles, or which the reports indicate involve juveniles as victims, suspects, or witnesses, are not reported at all. Crimes that are initially reported, but that are later determined not to have occurred, are called "unfounded" offenses. These incidents are excluded once they have been designated as unfounded. - Denver*
 - Cf. PACER data cleansing by Malamud, Swartz [NYTimes, Feb 13 2009]

- Explain, document, and educate Oakland citizens regarding
 - shared data standard
 - other OPD data reporting procedures
 - cf. Chief Edward Flynn vs. Milwaukee Journal
- Generate alternative analyses
- Help OPD communicate
 - Civilian complaint intake process
 - Improved website communications
 - Encourage community recommendations in the promotion process
 - “One of our commitments this new year is to strengthen our communication within our community, and better share crime information, prevention, response and enforcement results.” – *oak039441.pdf 25 Jan 13*

What C4A can do for OPD (cont.)

- Police academies
 - Develop a pipeline for city residents interested in joining the department at a young age.
 - Enhance officer training by continued inclusion of additional civilian instructors
